

With 2015 just around the corner, leaders in Meriwether County on Monday, December 15th had an opportunity to hear from our three local elected officials about expected priorities in the upcoming Legislative Session. On hand were Senator Josh McKoon; Representative Debbie Buckner and Representative-elect Bob Trammell, Jr. Organized by the Meriwether County Chamber of Commerce, the pre-legislative Town Hall was convened to create a forum for dialogue exchange and interaction.

As expected, transportation is likely to be one of the more prominent issues in the upcoming session with all three officials commenting about it. Noted was the failure of the T-SPLOST to pass in all but three regions in the state and the resulting shortfall in funding to support crumbling infrastructure on the state's roadways as well as any new transportation funding. In the last few weeks a Joint Study Committee on Critical Transportation Infrastructure Funding has been underway, a sixteen member committee charged with identifying new sources and methods of funding for critical transportation issues. Currently there is a \$900 million shortfall for current road improvements and a \$1.5 billion need for new construction. Several options have been discussed including redirecting the portion of the motor fuel tax that is now going to the general fund and dedicating that to the Department of Transportation. In addition there is expected to be conversation about increasing the motor fuel tax or adjusting the formula and creating a mechanism whereby counties could partner with one another to implement a modified regional T-SPLOST

On a very positive note, however, the officials talked about plans to support a \$5 million bond funding package for the Warm Springs rehabilitation and long-term acute care hospitals (Georgia Regents Health) to enable service delivery and infrastructure improvements to bring the facility up to code and to add bed capacity by making some of the rooms private.

Representative Buckner noted her plans to work on an assessment study to evaluate the pay structure; healthcare benefits and retirement options related to both current state employees and retirees.

Tom Donohue: Better Regulations Can Promote Jobs and Good Government. Santa Barbara (CA) Noozhawk

Santa Barbara (CA) Noozhawk publishes **U.S. Chamber of Commerce** President Tom **Donohue's** Examiner commentary, in which he writes that "one of the best government reform efforts would be to modernize our regulatory system," arguing that it "is increasingly opaque and driven by political agendas, lacks basic accountability, often employs flawed data and questionable science, ignores congressional intent, and too often prevents citizens from effectively weighing in on proposed rules." **Donohue** notes that the **U.S. Chamber of**

Commerce supports "regulatory reform that adheres to four commonsense, bipartisan principles," accountability, transparency, allowing "meaningful participation by stakeholders and citizens," and a "safe but swift" permitting process. **Donohue** adds that regulatory reform "will remain a top priority for the **Chamber** in 2015."

House Republicans filed a \$1.1 trillion spending plan Tuesday, capping weeks of negotiations with Senate Democrats to avoid a shutdown this week and put more of the government on firm footing through Sept. 30. A House vote could come Thursday but the current stopgap measure will need to be extended a few days to allow time for the Senate to act and the huge measure to go to the White House for President Obama's signature.

Senate clears tax break package.

The Hill reports that "The Senate cleared a \$41.6 billion package of tax breaks on Tuesday, sending the legislation to President Obama in one of the last substantive moves of this Congress. By a 76 to 16 vote, the Senate passed a measure that would extend more than four dozen tax breaks for both businesses and individuals just through 2014."
