


#### THE LITTLE WHITE HOUSE

The Little White House is one of Georgia's most popular historic sites. Tours are given daily of FDR's home, which has been carefully preserved, as well as the servants and guest quarters. #### **MANCHESTER MILL & VETERAN PARK**

Built in 1908 by Mr. Callaway as a textile mill and known for its twin smoke stacks which still stand, this recently burned structure features a memorial to Meriwether County Veterans, crafted from the original boiler room doors. Located on 10 Callaway Street 31816, Manchester, Ga. Be sure to stop by and feed the local ducks at one of the nearby city ponds.




#### MERIWETHER MURALS AND MONARCHS

Historic murals painted by Hapeville-based artist, John Christian, are featured in each of the seven cities of Meriwether County. Each mural highlights people, events and locations that tell the city's story, making touring "Meriwether Murals and Monarchs" a memory-making must. Also, look for accompanying butterfly gardens in multiple locations and for the common thread that ties the cities of Meriwether County together, which is woven into all seven murals.

#### THE RED OAK COVERED BRIDGE

An 1840's covered bridge, built by freed slave and noted bridge builder, Horace King, attracts hundreds of visitors every year. At 391 feet, including the approaches, this structure is the oldest and longest wooden covered bridge still in use in Georgia and may very well be one of the sturdiest. This "Kissing Bridge" was featured in the movie, "Lawless" and is still open to traffic, including the annual Kissing Bridge Classic, a Chainbuster gravel race. #### ROOSEVELT WARM SPRINGS

Founded by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt in 1927 as a polio rehabilitation facility where patients could heal together in the warm and mineral rich springs. Now RWS focuses on continuing President Roosevelt's legacy through empowering individuals with disabilities to achieve personal independence and employment success through Vocational Rehabilitation programs. 706-655-5670

#### SCENIC BYWAY

The Meriwether-Pike County Scenic Byway celebrates the unique legacy of Franklin Delano Roosevelt and retraces some of FDR's favorite routes through Meriwether County, many of which have changed very little in the past 70 years. Travelers can pick up the route at any point throughout the 55-mile loop; however, the preferred departure point is the Warm Springs Welcome Center, a re-creation of the depot where FDR would arrive into Warm Springs.

#### WARM SPRINGS NATIONAL FISH HATCHERY

Visitors can enjoy feeding the fish in the display ponds, hiking a nature trail, bird watching, and learning about fish and wildlife in the public aquarium. Free Admission. Open year round. 706-655-3382.

#### TRAMMELL HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST

Experience a bit of history at this 1840 ancestral house which was the former home of Captain John William Trammell. This B&B, located in Luthersville, has been restored and furnished in keeping with the era, featuring some modern amenities while maintaining the nostalgic feel with original hand planed boards, chimneys and fire-places. Four private bedrooms are within the two-story home, each with a private bath. Captain Trammell's tomb and burial spot, at the Luthersville cemetery, is within walking distance. Find us on Facebook.

#### WOODBURY RESEARCH FACILITY

#### TRAIN OBSERVATION DECK

The Railfan Observation Deck is located behind the Main Street Shops of Manchester with a perfect view of the Yard. This deck is dedicated to the memory of Tyron Elliot, a local attorney and railfan who spearheaded the annual Railroad Days celebration from its inception until his death in 2010. The gazebo is equipped with two picnic tables and is a great location for photographs. You can expect about 40 trains during a 24-hour period to slowly roll through this Waycross split of Atlanta and Birmingham Mains.

#### AVIATION



## The Flint River Water Trail



The Flint River flows 346 miles through Georgia from north of the Atlanta Airport to the southwest corner of the state where it joins the Chattahoochee River at Lake Seminole to form the Apalachicola River, which crosses the Florida panhandle to the Gulf of Mexico.

In Meriwether County, the Flint River flows approximately 28 miles from North to South and offers some of the most scenic beauty, rare plant and animal species, with open vistas of soaring mountain ranges.


#### DOWNTOWN WARM SPRINGS


Gay, located on the main highway connecting Atlanta and Columbus, was a quiet farm community with an active business district and faced an uncertain future in 1971. Agritourism had yet to be coined as a word in 1972, but it has played a significant role in economic change in Gay.

The Cotton Fair is Georgia's premier agritourism event. On the first weekends of May and October, more than 30,000 visitors to Gay enjoy a 21st century celebration.

Gay is also home to Big Red Oak Plantation. Quail, deer, turkey, dove and pheasant hunting combine with fishing and sporting clay ranges with 5-stand and on-site lodging to make Big Red Oak a sportsman's paradise and corporate event destination.

In 2008, Quercus Farm added QC Arena to a grand mix of prize cattle and King Ranch Heritage Quarter horses to provide West Georgia the equestrian venue of choice. Rodeo, barrel racing, roping, cutter, and hunter jumper events take place under the 1.2-acre covered riding arena throughout the year.


## Greenville

Greenville, the county seat of Meriwether County, became a city in 1828 named in honor of Revolutionary war hero General Nathaniel Greene. The Great Cyclone of 1893 destroyed the courthouse, all of downtown Greenville. Many of the 175 homes were severely damaged or destroyed but fortunately most of the historic homes survived. Then in 1976, the courthouse burned but Publix founder, George W. Jenkins, a Meriwether County native, saw fit to donate through the Publix Foundation to have the courthouse restored. Now all of downtown Greenville, with its well-preserved 19th century architecture, and a large portion of the residential areas are recognized as a Historic District in the National Register of Historic Places.

The Meriwether Historical Society offers a self guided driving tour to immerse yourself in the rich heritage of the antebellum homes and local legends. For example, the Hiram Warner house, located at LaGrange Street, which was originally a one-story Greek Revival Home built in 1835. In 1865 a Yankee band of soldiers looted the home and hung Hiram Warner twice, trying to get him to tell where he had buried gold on the property. They left him for dead but took the leather lariat used to hang him with. He survived both hangings and served as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Georgia from 1867-1880.

## Lone Oak

Halfway between Hogansville and Luthersville you will find Lone Oak, a town that is literally one square mile in size, located at the northern end of the County.


Incorporated at the turn of the century, Lone Oak's population is now 180. As the community looks toward future growth, its efforts are focused on revitalization and infrastructure expansion projects and on making plans to refurbish many of its older buildings.

Lone Oak's most notable attraction is the Lone Oak Arts and Crafts Festival, held annually on the first Saturday of November. The festival attracts more than 2000 visitors who enjoy the wares of a variety of vendors.

Lone Oak visitors can enjoy the small town charm and explore the local area, which features scenic country roads and historic sites offering a glimpse into rural life in the southern United States.

# Luthersville

Incorporated in 1872, Luthersville was named for Martin Luther, the 16th century German Protestant Revolution leader and currently is comprised of approximately 3.1 square miles.

The Central of Georgia Railroad contributed to Luthersville's early prosperity at the turn of the century and now is recognized as the "Gateway into Meriwether County," since it serves as a major entrance to the county from the north along GA Highways 27 and 54.

Luthersville has the potential to be the location where increased residential growth occurs in the near future as it continues to make a conscious effort to revitalize its commercial core. The city is home to several agricultural businesses.

## Manchester

Named for Manchester, England, Manchester, Georgia is known as the Magic City and is the largest in Meriwether county. Manchester was created in 1909 at the time the Atlanta, Birmingham, Atlantic (A.B.A.) Railroad partnered with a local mill. A "rail fan" observation deck been has constructed overlooking the CSX rail yard which is one of the busiest rail lines in Georgia. providing great views and photo opportunities of incoming and outgoing train cars.

Manchester is the most developed region in Meriwether County and the most populous city in the region.

Downtown Manchester offers a traditional Southern Main Street with a variety of shops, a Mexican Restaurant and the newly restored President Theatre. Novelist Stuart Woods, even chose Manchester as the setting for his best-seller, "Chiefs" and has chosen someone from this city as a character in most of his subsequent books.

## Warm Springs

Originally called Bullochville, Warm Springs was referred to as the "spa town" in the 19th century became home to Meriwether Inn, a popular tourist attraction which is still open to travelers with much of its historical features preserved. The therapeutic qualities of the nearly 90 degrees springs, is what brought Franklin Delano Roosevelt here for decades, staying in what is now known as the Little White House. The investment of much of his personal fortune brought Roosevelt Warm Springs Institute for Rehabilitation into existence, becoming an international treatment center The Meriwether Inn. White House and Roosevelt Warm Springs Institute are all open for tours.

History is evident in the 100-year-old restored buildings on the bustling Street and through alleyways, which provide a unique shopping experience. Food to please multiple palettes, including the world-famous Bulloch House with its fried green tomatoes and buffet is conveniently located. Located on the southern end of town is the Little White House, where President Franklin Delano Roosevelt spent his happiest times with those who loved him the most. Not a month goes by without a festival or innovative program taking place in Warm Springs.

# Woodbury

Woodbury, believed to be the oldest city in Meriwether county, was initially known as Sandtown. When the first post office was established in 1848, the name was changed to Woodberry then changed again in 1854 to Woodbury. In 1887 the first rail service came to Woodbury and became the rail line President Franklin D. Roosevelt used to reach his "Little White House" in Warm Springs.

During the 1920's, the New York based company, Hills Brothers Company brought their pimento pepper packing operation to Woodbury. In 1942, the Atlanta Constitution described the pepper plant operation as the largest pimento pepper canning plant in the world, made popular and grown primarily by the women of Woodbury. By 1950, Woodbury earned the nickname of "Pimento Capital of the World". These days, Woodbury is known more for its restaurants and shopping.

Woodbury offers a charming historic downtown, featuring a variety of antique shops, restaurants, and historic buildings. Beyond shopping and trying the local culinary cuisine, a short ride to Fitzgerald Fruit Farms offers a scenic drive to a destination with homemade ice cream and muscadine wines.

Woodbury is surrounded by beautiful countryside, making it an ideal destination for outdoor enthusiasts. The nearby Flint River and Lake Meriwether offer recreational opportunities, such as hiking, fishing, boating and camping.




