

Cost is \$75-\$105 for female dogs depending on weight; male dogs \$70-\$100 depending on weight; female cats \$55 and male cats \$45. 1. Olives could be Georgia's New Popular Crop. In Toombs County, Terra Colce Farms just won the highest award out of 651 entries at the New York International Olive Oil competition. Native to the Mediterranean, olive oil production in the U. S. has traditionally been pursued in California, Arizona and Texas. But South Georgia is changing the landscape. Could Meriwether County join the game?

#### 2. Macon-Bibb oppose gun law: Macon-Bibb Commissioners recently

*passed a resolution* to officially oppose the new gun law in Georgia. The new law, known as the Safe Carry Protection Act goes into effect on July 1<sup>st</sup> and allows residents who have concealed carry permits to take guns into some bars, churches, school zones, government buildings and certain parts of airports. The Macon-Bibb Commissioners expressed concern about the new law giving latitude for individuals to carry guns into public events such as the Cherry Blossom Festival. The resolution will be sent to state officials along with a letter asking for parts of the law to be changed.

3. "Skills Gap" comes at a cost - Accenture and The Manufacturing Institute

recently conducted a study of over 300 manufacturing executives. Of those polled 39% said they were facing a "severe shortage" of skilled workers and 60 % said it was "difficult" to hire employees with the skills needed for the open positions. And this is expensive!! For a 2000 employee factory, producing \$500 million in gross revenues, it is estimated that manufacturers are losing 11% of their operating earnings or \$4.6 million per year.

**4.** Congress aims to bypass Obama on Keystone pipeline....the Washington Times reports "the movement to bypass President Obama and approve the Keystone XL oil pipeline through congressional action has more momentum than ever, with a key Senate committee set to vote on a bill to green light the massive Canada-to-Texas project".
