


City of Manchester's Recreation Department will again host the sixth Summer of Champions Sports Camp; a free camp



### Jobless rate lowest in five years

Employers added 288,000 jobs in April, the most since January 2012, while the unemployment rate fell to a five-year low in data released Friday by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The jobless rate fell from 6.7 percent in March to 6.3 percent, the lowest level since September 2008.
